## President's Report

Hi All, As you maybe aware my wife Tracey and I have just returned from a wonderful 3 month trip around the western half of Australia. While I was away Eric was acting President and he was ably assisted by secretary Michael - a big thanks to both of them for helping out.

On my return we squeezed in a committee meeting in early August but Covid continues play havoc with our activities and the August meeting and camp had to be cancelled. I hope I am wrong but I fear that the delta variant of covid will continue to result in lockdowns and an "on again off again" situation until a large proportion of the population is vaccinated.

Unfortunately it is likely that for September numbers at outdoor gathering will be restricted again so an official camp is unlikely. Myself and the club secretary Michael will do our best to keep members updated but sometimes our notifications may come just prior to an activity so keep an eye on the media and on your emails. #### **AGM**

Before I share a little about my Holiday I remind all that September is normally when we hold our AGM. We have a great committee at the moment and most have indicated that they are continuing in their roles. However we have vacancies for a Membership Secretary and Field Officers. #### **Hart Holiday**

Very fortunately our holiday was not marred by any covid restrictions with the exception of the last leg of the journey when we needed to get out of SA before it became a red zone. In one day I drove 13 hours from Ceduna to the border but it was worth it to avoid having to isolate at home for 14 days and have multiple tests.

Tracey and I did a lot of fun tourist stuff on the trip and I have been asked to give a presentation at one of our general meetings. However for this report I thought I would give members a brief summary of the metal detecting I did on the journey.

The road trip started in SA and then went up through the middle via the Flinders Ranges, Cober Pedy, Uluru and Alice Springs etc. At Tenant Creek they have a small common area about 50 Km from town. After an hour or two of detecting I decided I would go back to the entrance and picked up a 5.7 g nugget beside the road. It was about 20 cm down but I still picked it up with the GPX

5000 and Sadie coil.

After this we went to Mataranka Springs and Katherine before heading to Lake Argyle and Kununarra and the Bungle Bungles. I took my boat out on Lake Argyle and got a large silver cobler which was very nice eating.

The next stop was Halls Creek and we stayed at "Old Halls Creek" for 2 nights. It was good value at \$10 / night and you are right on the gold. Due to the heat, spinifex and other weeds it was not easy detecting and I only picked up a 0.9 gram nugget here. However I spoke to 3 guys who got 3.5 oz in 3 weeks.

Following this we spent about 6 days in Broome before heading to Marble Bar for a couple of nights. I only got a small piece on the common but had a very interesting experience which I will share at my presentation.

In the coastal holiday areas I did use the Equinox 800 and picked up a bunch of coins, a couple of rings and a lot of lead – mainly sinkers but a few bullets also. My most interesting find was a heavily encrusted belt buckle which most likely would have been awarded to a Rodeo rider.

After Karijini national park we went to Exmouth, Denham and Kalbari for about 2 weeks. The coral coast was really nice except it was too windy so I only got out in the boat a couple of times. At the start of July we headed to Carnavon and then stopped for two nights at a very nice Caravan Park at Yalgoo. I went to the local common area twice but no luck.

The final gold detecting for the trip was done at Leonora where I caught up with Laurie, Shirley and Imi. Lauri and I did

the Gold Talk Leonora 3 day course which was quite good in my opinion. It also gave us access to some fairly large lease areas which we could detect on for up to a month on each lease. Laurie and I got some smaller bits and I was lucky to pick up a 4.4 g nugget at about 25 cm on my third last day. It was at the end of someone else's patch but it was quite close to a piece of timber so was probably missed.

A big thanks to Shirley who kept Tracey company in Leonora and made it possible for me to detect for a little longer than I thought I would.

Now back to some important club matters.

#### **Camps Coming Up.**

Spring and early summer are very popular camps and if covid doesn't get in the way they will be lots of fun.

Sep – we are looking to have a Fathers Day Breakfast on the Sunday with a prize for a lucky Dad.

Oct – this camp coincides with the Laenecoorie Gold Bash and unfortunately I see that it has just been cancelled.

Nov – this is traditionally our Melbourne Cup weekend and we have a big sweep stake as well as a meal.

However please take note - By now most members would be aware of the different announcements which might be made at the end of this lockdown and we need to stay flexible. For September we will either still be locked down or public gathering will be restricted to 10 again in which case no official seekers camp will take place. Following recent incidents in the press with a large indoor party in Melbourne, members need to be very careful regarding the size of any gatherings to

avoid large individual fines and potentially giving the VSC a bad name.

If in Oct and Nov outdoor gathering are restricted to 30 or more an official camp is likely but depending on the exact number allowed and the weather outlook we might have an alternate site.

Continue to review our membership position in light of high prospective membership demand and number limits at some camp locations


Spreading the workload and making it

## Growing Partnerships

Here is an article by PMAV Vice president Jason Cornish taken from their last Eureka Echo detailing their meeting with the resources minister Jaclyn Symes at Heathcote to launch the new video and brochure, 'A guide to Recreational Prospecting in Victoria. Our Anja McKnight features on the front cover.

For two years now the PMAV committee has been talking to the Victorian government about continued access to land, the proposed creation of more national parks and protecting our industry.

The PMAV wants to foster a working partnership with government departments and we have been meeting with Jaclyn Symes, Minister for Agriculture, Regional Development and Resources and also the Department of Resources.

PMAV President, Mathew Carkeek has been at the forefront of this new partnership and has spent a lot of time and energy on building relationships with officials. One of the small but valuable items was the creation of a new informative guide - 'A guide to Recreational Prospecting in Victoria'.



With PMAV guidance, the department has been helpful in changing the layout and terminology, including minimising the term "fossicker" and references to "fossicking" which does not have any legal protection under

the Mines Act. It also diminishes what prospectors do.

In November 2020, the Department of Resources asked us to organise a photo shoot at the Heathcote creek reserve, several PMAV members and their families were good enough to attend.

Thank you to all those who helped on the day. Here are some of the great photos.

The photos and video were then used to create marketing material for the new guide as well as a short promotional video which the PMAV was given access to before being made public. Our feedback was welcomed and several phrases edited and changed.

In March 2021, at the same location in =cal launch of the guide was again partnership with the PMAV.

The PMAV also presented the Minister with small gifts for her children and offered her family the chance to come prospecting again.

We appreciate the validity and economic importance the Minister and her department have for prospecting in Victoria. Our working relationship is of high importance to the PMAV and should be for all prospectors, but we are also wary of how quickly things can change under a leader's or political parties directive.

Who can forget the 2015, when she stood shoulder to shoulder with Rita Bentley (VALE) and promised the PMAV support for land access?


Years later this same minister is now the Environment Minister and helped close over 14,000Ha of once accessible public land in Bendigo to prospectors and now at the forefront of a new drive to lock-up another 77,000 hectares of goldfields on public land in Central Victoria.

Minister D'Ambrosio has for the last four years ignored all requests for a meeting with the PMAV, but that is not unexpected considering the amount of scrutiny we have brought to her decisions against rural communities and bush users.

That said, we are optimistic that the current Re sources Minister and especially the department, can see the health, social and economic value that prospecting brings to our golden state.




